Relationship between Core Strategy polices and existing local plan policies

The Waste Core Strategy will be followed by two additional Development Plan Documents:

- Development Policies Document
- Site Allocations Document

These will be produced in parallel over the period to November 2009 and once all three documents are adopted they will replace the existing Waste Local Plan.

This table outlines the existing local plan policies which will be superseded by the Waste Core Strategy once it is adopted (scheduled March 2009). A number of existing policies will be addressed by the other two Development Plan Documents and are currently saved until those documents are adopted.
