Admission rules for community and voluntary controlled co-educational and single sex schools for the school year 2005-2006 (except Tring).

Admissions rules for Tring voluntary controlled co-educational school for the school year 2005-2006.

March 2004

1. Arrangements for admission to the Sixth Forms of community and voluntary controlled schools have traditionally been administered by the individual schools themselves. The revised Admissions Code of Practice introduced a requirement for an appeals system and the determination of an admission number for each Sixth Form.
2. The admission number for Sixth Forms will only be applied to students who have not previously attended the school's Year 11 and who are therefore being admitted for the first time to the roll of the school in Year 12.
3. A summary of the current criteria, initially adopted on an interim basis in April 2003, or subsequently amended for admission to the sixth form for Hertfordshire secondary schools is set out in the attached schedule.

*On the Schedule * indicates arrangement for 2003-04. When proposed arrangements for 2004-05 are available, they will be published on the Council's Website.*
